<p>Week beginning: 07/10/24 Theme: Changes on our planet</p> <p>The children will be:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Talking about the autumnal changes taking place around them and visiting the park to look at these changes. • Talking about animals and their preparations for winter. • Learning about Harvest and how it is celebrated around the world. • Making their own soup using seasonal vegetables. • Learning a selection of Harvest songs and rhymes. • Matching objects according to their size, shape and colour. Sorting into the same and different. 	<p>Week beginning: 14/10/24 Theme: What can I see in space?</p> <p>The children will be:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Reading a selection of non-fiction books about the planets. • Naming and creating their own representations of the planets. • Making a telescope and using the VR goggles to explore space scenes. • Making their own books about space and the planets. • Creating their own planets based on their interests. • Comparing mass, size and capacity through practical activities. • Looking at famous paintings and creating their own representations. 	<p>Week beginning: 21/10/24 Theme: There's an alien in the playground!</p> <p>The children will be:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Designing and creating their own alien planets and spacecraft. • Reading a selection of stories including Q Pootle 5 and There's an alien in your book. • Talking about how we are all different but all friends. • Investigating how things grow and live on our planet and what we need to survive. • Designing a menu for an alien tea party and creating their own party food. 	<p>Ongoing Learning:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Learning the names of our new friends and teachers. • Learning the routines of the setting and how to use the equipment safely and fairly. • Developing our confidence asking for things we need and want. <p>Phonics: Nursery – exploring environmental sounds and instrumental sounds.
