Physical Education

Reading Records

Now we are back for a new term, children should be straight backing into home and school reading. Please ensure you are reading with your child at least once a week and recording in the reading record. This is vital to develop your child's inference skills and fluency.

Last term there were unfortunately many times where children were not recording their reading or showing evidence of reading with an adult at home- this is something that is monitored closely.

Please ensure you are checking your child is bringing their record to school every day and bringing it home. Reading is essential for the development of many skills and is also an enjoyable experience.

Thank you to those who are regularly reading with their child and communicating this in reading records. If you need any advice or support with reading with your child at home, please speak to your child's class teacher.

Maths and Spelling homework will be sent home on the Friday of each week (except during school holidays). All homework is due back on Tuesday. Your child should keep their homework in the purple folder provided last year. Spelling homework requires a parent signature. Maths homework should be completed in pencil in the small red exercise book provided.
